Basic Operations of the Calculator

Locate the basic keys on the image and review their functions in the numbered list.



- 1 **On** turns on the calculator.
- 2 **2nd** turns on the 2nd indicator and accesses the function shown above the next key you press.
- 3 **Off** turns off the calculator and clears the display.
- 4 **Enter** completes the operation or executes the command.
- 5 **=** recalls the most recently calculated result and displays it as Ans.
- 6 **+/-** toggles the answer between fraction and decimal, exact square root and decimal, and exact pi and decimals formats.
- 7 **C** allows you to move the cursor on the screen and in operations as necessary.
